Dear Preston Resident

We hope by now that you have heard of the decision, made at the Village Meeting on 26th June, to produce a Neighbourhood Plan for Preston Parish.

The Neighbourhood Plan is being drawn up by a Steering Group appointed by the Parish Council.

The results of this Questionnaire will determine the underpinning principles and overall direction of our Plan. So, it is very important that you and your family take this opportunity to make your views known.

We want everyone to have their say. If you feel there are issues we have not addressed, please tell us about them in the space at the end of this questionnaire.

A main focus of the Neighbourhood Plan is housing and future development. Our Neighbourhood Plan will need to follow the principles set out in the Local Plan by our local planning authority, North Herts District Council.

If you are aged 16 or over please complete a copy of this Adult Questionnaire. If you are aged 10 to 15 years please complete a copy of the Youth Questionnaire.

If you are aged 9 or under, and you would like to be involved, please use the sheet of paper we have left for you. Either write something you like about living in Preston or draw us a picture.

The Questionnaire should be completed in time for it to be collected from your home at the end of January. If you are not available the PNP representative will call back. Alternatively you can contact the Steering Group (see Survey Help on the back cover) to arrange a convenient time for you.

Please remember, there is no right or wrong response. We just need to know what YOU think. If you have any queries about the questionnaire, or the Neighbourhood Plan, please:



Introduction

The Neighbourhood Plan will become the voice of our community in guiding development, infrastructure and facilities. It will be instrumental in shaping the future of our Parish. This is why we urge everyone over 16 years of age to complete the Questionnaire and have their say.

What is this Questionnaire for?

This questionnaire is to gather evidence from everyone living in Preston. The information obtained from this questionnaire, along with other evidence, will inform the Preston Neighbourhood Plan (PNP).

Robust evidence is needed for our Neighbourhood Plan, as it will become a legally binding document. We need every adult in Preston to fill in a questionnaire to make sure his or her voice is heard.

What is a Neighbourhood Plan?

A Neighbourhood Plan is a new type of plan, introduced by the Localism Act 2011. Neighbourhood Plans are prepared by the local community and can include planning policies and land allocations. The Plan must be consistent with national and local planning policies and cannot be used to prevent development.

A Neighbourhood Plan allows communities to shape their development. The Government is placing emphasis on planning at the local level because it believes that local people know best what local needs are and how they can be met.

A Neighbourhood Plan outlines what the community would like with regards to housing, business and community facilities. There must be general conformity with the North Herts District Council (NHDC) Local Plan strategy and policies.

This means, although the Neighbourhood Plan will not stop development, it can stipulate guidelines for the size and style of developments as well as indicate local amenities, facilities and infrastructure that the community requires.

What influence does a Neighbourhood Plan have?

Following consultation, an examination and a successful referendum, a neighbourhood plan will become part of the statutory development plan and will be used when determining planning applications.

This Neighbourhood Plan, if approved in a Parish referendum, will also set out legally binding policies on how land in and around Preston can be used.

North Herts District Council (NHDC) Local Plan

Under current local and central government policies, a policy of 'no development' in Preston is not an available option for our Neighbourhood Plan, so please bear this in mind when completing the questionnaire. NHDC have identified a target of 21 for new homes in Preston on the NHDC owned field off Castlefield to be built between now and 2031. The Preston Neighbourhood Plan (PNP) will cover the same period as the NHDC Local Plan. That is from now until 2031.

A guide to the Questionnaire

How has it been decided what to include in this questionnaire?

Previous consultations with people from our community have been used to inform this questionnaire which has been designed by the Preston Parish Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group in consultation with a professional researcher, Becky Lewis of The Insight Fountain.

The questionnaire includes topics relevant to people in our community that can be included in the Neighbourhood Plan. We know that there are other issues that are important to you but these cannot be included in the Neighbourhood Plan and so are not covered here. Some issues included in this questionnaire may not be in the final Neighbourhood Plan.

Who needs to fill in the questionnaire?

When the PNP representative called at your house they will have asked how many adults and young people live at your address and left a questionnaire for each person.

This is a questionnaire for each adult aged 16 or over.

There is also a young resident questionnaire for young people aged 10-15. This questionnaire is shorter than the adult version and asks about issues more relevant to young people in the community. There is also a sheet for the under 10's who would like to be involved.

What do I need to do?

Please fill in your questionnaire. For each question there are instructions on how to fill it in and to let you know whether to put one tick or several. It is your opinions that we are interested in and there are no right or wrong answers. There is opportunity for you to give your own opinion and thoughts as well.

If you have more to say or would like to talk to the Steering Group about any issues raised in the questionnaire please see Survey Help on the back cover for our contact details.

When everyone from your household has filled in a questionnaire, please put them all into the envelope provided and seal it.

What happens next?

Your PNP representative will call to collect the envelope. If you are not in they will call back several times or you can contact the Steering Group (see Survey Help on the back cover) to arrange a convenient time for your envelope to be collected.

Sealed envelopes containing the completed questionnaires will be forwarded to the research team at **The Insight Fountain** and **We Work With Data**, who will manage the data entry, data processing and analysis of the survey.

They will report back aggregated results to the PNP Steering Group, which we will use to help inform the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan.

Results from the survey will be made available and a public meeting held to discuss the implications and recommendations for the Preston Neighbourhood Plan

Is what I say confidential?

What you say will be analysed statistically for multiple choice and some open (free text) questions — who said what to these questions will be treated in confidence.

Other open questions will be read to identify themes and issues — useful phrases may be taken from answers to illustrate a theme or issue in the report. The research team will not identify who said what, but it is always possible the identity of somebody can be guessed because of what they wrote.

Your completed questionnaire will only be seen by the research team - with the following two exceptions:

- If you have any issues you would like to discuss with the Steering Group please email or fill in the inside back sheet (page 27). The Steering Group will read what you have said on that sheet (page 27) in full.
- 2. If you mark up the map in Question E4 (page 18) with any additional views, page 18 may be copied to the Steering Group for additional analysis

The research team will not identify who filled in pages 18 and 27 to the Steering Group.

We are asking for your postcode and other demographic details (such as gender and age) so that we can check we have spoken to people from across the community. Where we report on sub groups (such as women or people who work at home) it will only be if it applies to several people in the parish and no one person is identifiable.

The return envelope is numbered so we can verify each household in the community has had an equal chance of taking part.

The Insight Fountain and We Work With Data are members of the Market Research Society (MRS) and abide by the MRS code of conduct. They are both registered as a data controller with the Information Commissioners Office (ICO) and have carried out Neighbourhood Plan Surveys previously.

3. Housing and Development


- We know from previous consultations that development is a topic many people in Preston are passionate about.
- We are keen to ensure that the views of people currently living here are taken into account in any future planning and development. It is therefore crucial that we have reliable, valid and robust data to use as evidence.
- When answering the questions please think about the needs of the parish and both the positive and negative effects of sizes and types of development on the future character and infrastructure of the community.
- Remember that only once the Neighbourhood Plan has been agreed and approved will it form part of the North Herts District Council Local Plan.
- These questions are not about remedying current issues. They are about safeguarding future changes to the status quo in our Parish.

The NHDC Local Plan has been drafted. This draft plan identifies the permitted development area within Preston Parish (inside the red boundary line).

It includes one site allocated for development for 21 new homes, to be built on land off Templars Lane between now and 2031 (shaded dark red and marked PR1).

The NHDC Local Plan is likely to be approved before a Preston Parish Neighbourhood Plan is.

This means, that although the Neighbourhood Plan will not stop this specific development, it can influence the size and style of the development as well as indicate local amenities, facilities and infrastructure that the community requires.

4. Environment and Heritage

The questions in this section are based on the beauty, character and heritage of the Village and its Parish. Whilst all proposals for development must comply with current European, National and Local policy, the Neighbourhood Plan could provide additional protection for aspects of our Parish.

Central and local government departments have in recent years examined certain features in Preston Parish, and given them a legal status. These features have national or local significance; regulations exist to protect them, on behalf of all of us.

Wain Wood


Natural England has designated Wain Wood as a Site of Special Scientific Interest under Section 28 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (marked in blue). It is an area of diverse flora and ancient deciduous woodland, known to have existed before 1600.

Bunyan's Dell in Wain Wood is a natural amphitheatre used by John Bunyan whilst preaching to his "gathered Church" - sometimes 1,000 people!

Other areas are sites of Local Wildlife Value. Certain trees have Tree Protection Orders. Bridleways, footpaths and our section of The Hertfordshire Way, have a legal status.

Temple Dinsley / Princess Helena College

The garden and other land at Temple Dinsley is registered under the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953, within the Register of Historic Parks and Gardens by English Heritage for its special historic interest (marked in magenta/pink).



Temple Dinsley was an important property of the Order of the Knights Templar from 1147 – 1313, and of the Order of the Knights Hospitaller from 1313 - 1540's. English Heritage has registered the gardens and park of Princess Helena College as being of historic landscape importance. They were designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens and Gertrude Jekyll during the Edwardian period.

Conservation Area and Listed Buildings

Much of the parish lies within an Area of Landscape Conservation (marked in red).

English Heritage has awarded Listed Building status to 50 buildings or structures in this Parish. These include many houses, cottages, barns, St. Martin's Church and its lychgate and mausoleum, the PHC entrance gate piers and its park wall, and also, the well including its gear and the telephone kiosk both on the Village Green.


A particular richness in our local 'built environment' is the work of the nationally significant architect, Sir Edwin Lutyens. Temple Dinsley, Ladygrove cottages and former farm buildings, Chequers Cottages nos. 1-6 in Chequers Lane, are all, amongst others, part of his legacy to Preston.


